# Marr-Mac's Story...

Deane Marr and her mother, Jaqueline Macdonald, founded Marr-Mac Schools Ltd. in 1968 (Marr-Mac). Marr-Mac began as a dance school and day-care centre, and was run by mother and daughter until Mrs. Macdonald passed away in 1976.

After Mrs. MacDonald's passing, both schools continued to run until the daycare was closed in 1999. The dance school primarily taught ballet and jazz and over the years has expanded its program to include several disciplines of dance.

In 1997, Mrs. Marr took on business partner Cathy McFarlane, who had been teaching classical ballet and character dance for Marr-Mac for 14 years prior.

The same year, the studio moved to its current location in the Windsor Plaza building. The friendly & artistic community of Old Strathcona has been a perfect location for the studio.

Deane Marr retired in June 2015, leaving behind a legacy for the love of dance and the people it touches. Her leadership at the studio has filtered through to the instructors and is demonstrated by the care and attention given to each dancer and their individual needs.

Marie McFarlane has taken on the roles of Co-Owner and Co-Director with her mother Cathy. Marie has trained at Marr Mac in all disciplines since the age of 2, and has become an accomplished teacher and choreographer in jazz, lyrical and contemporary. Her strengths balance her mom and business partner Cathy's, whose primary focus is Russian Vaganova classical ballet training. Together they have devised a program which includes a multi-faceted training system. It offers today's dancer the ability to become well rounded artists, and equips them to either go out into the dance world and confidently audition with a high technical and artistic standard, become skilled instructors, or simply love and appreciate the art of dance.

# 2/ Studio Philosophy

'To instill the love of dance and music, and to provide a supportive atmosphere which encourages students of all abilities'.

As our studio evolves year after year, our philosophy remains the same...

- We offer an alternative studio atmosphere where dancers, parents and friends feel welcome, and where all levels of classes are prioritized equally.
- We ensure quality and commitment to each class from the recreational to the preprofessional level.
  - We expect a lot from ourselves and our students... we love what we do.

We're proud of our ability to offer a training program that enables our dancers to become well-rounded, well-trained dancers who are prepared to go into the professional world and do it all... well!

It's important to us at Marr Mac that all members of our team share our vision, our purpose and the philosophy that encompasses everything we do both in and outside of our classes. This is a vision that is shared and demonstrated by the directors, teachers and staff members at our studio and it is the driving force behind every interaction with our students and their families.

# 3/ Registration

Our new registration system allows all registration to be done online through our website. When you register online, you will be prompted to accept our waivers for our cancellation policy, media release, and attendance/dress code policy. By registering in person and filling out a registration form you are agreeing to our policies and waivers.

You can register early for each season at the Marr Mac Office or online at www.marrmac.com any time in <u>June</u> each year. Classes do reach capacity and waitlists are formed.

Our Pre-Registration dates for the 2022-2023 Season will be held in June, 2022.

Our annual registration fee is \$47.25 per family and must be paid in full prior to the commencement of classes. Payments can be paid online through our Parent Portal once registered. Our preferred method of payment is Credit Card through this portal. Please ensure you get your payment in via Credit Card, Internet Bank Transfer (E-Transfer: No password required), Cash or Cheque as failure to pay your registration fee in time may result in losing your place in the class. # 4/ COVID Protocols

#### **Marr Mac Covid Protocols**

- Instructors and Marr Mac Staff are required to wear a mask at all times
- Students are required to wear a mask at all times unless they cannot due to mental or physical concerns or limitations, or any other protected ground under the Alberta Human Rights Act that prevent them from wearing a face covering
- City of Edmonton mask by law does not require a mask during physical exercise, however to protect our students and staff, we are asking a mask be worn during class
- Parents will need to discuss mask exceptions with the office
- Students and Parents must be aware of and complete the daily screening checklist at home before entering the studio, and stay home if any symptoms are present
- If a dancer has a symptom that is concerning to an instructor or one of the members of the Marr Mac staff, the student will be brought to the office and a parent will be contacted for pick up
- All staff and students (and parents if they enter) are asked to sanitize their hands on the way in and out of the studio and the classrooms at the sanitization stations
- All patrons entering the studio premise must sign-in at the sign-in table
- Change rooms will be open for changing and/or breaks, however all belongings must stay with the students at all times and will not be stored in change rooms during classes
- We ask that students come changed and ready for class wherever possible
- We are asking all instructors, parents and students to be mindful of congestion in the hallways. Parents of younger children may come into the studio to drop off and pick up, but are asked to leave the studio during class time
- The waiting room will remain closed this year
- Instructors will clean all high-touch surfaces between classes including barres, cubbies, door handles, etc.
- Students will store all belongings in a cubby in the classroom at the beginning of the class
- Marr Mac will not follow a cohort policy this year. Instead, we encourage students to
  distance as much as possible in all classes. For example, while standing at the barre or
  completing exercises in the center of the studio. Distancing will not be required ie.
  choreography.

# 5/ Attendance Policy

Your child's attendance in class is very important to their peers and our teaching staff. As a member of the team, it is a commitment for you to ensure your child attends their classes on time each week and attends all lessons planned for them. Not only do absences impact their progress and competition or year-end show routines we create, it also impacts the social and confidence-building principals we work hard to foster in each age group.

If you know ahead of time that your child will be absent due to holidays/vacations, commitments or school trips, please let us know ahead of time so the class impact is minimal. If your child is too unwell to attend class, we ask that you inform our admin team by phone (780-434-9281) or email (1968@marrmac.com) as soon as you can so they can let the teachers know and preparations can be made to catch up on any missed work.

Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate make-up sessions for students who miss classes, but will make every endeavour to schedule a catch-up class in the unlikely event that Marr Mac needs to cancel a lesson.

**Competitive Dancers**: Marr Mac follows a strict attendance policy for dancers in the competitive stream, as dancers need to maintain a certain level of technique and training. This attendance policy applies to all classes that dancers are enrolled in: technique, support, choreography etc. The competitive schedule has been constructed to ensure the dancers are receiving the adequate balance of strength, stretch, cardio, and instruction based on their level and age.

Competitive dancers have a "3 miss" attendance policy, where 3 misses are allowed per class between September and the end of competition season. Once the student has reached 3 misses, a make-up class form will be issued for the student. Students must discuss with the instructor which classes can be taken as a make-up class. If there are more than 3 misses in a class, participation in competition may need to be assessed by the instructor. We, at Marr Mac, understand that rare circumstances may come up and every one must be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

### **COVID Attendance Flexibility:**

Please note that we are aware that with a pandemic present, attendance will need to fluctuate more than usual due to illness or self-isolation. Please ensure you are staying up to date with the current protocols for self-isolation, and staying home when sick or when advised to do so by AHS.

We will do our best to offer make-up classes to those students who miss due to illness or isolation and each student will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Please keep the office posted at all times with any absences and concerns.

# 6/ Dress Code Policy

At Marr Mac we believe that if you look like a dancer, you feel like a dancer.

We expect that all dancers follow the dress code including hair requirements.

#### 7/Waviers & Policies

Please note these policies must be agreed upon at time of registration

#### **Attendance Policy**

Marr-Mac's attendance policy expects students to attend their classes on a regular weekly basis. If you are planning a vacation outside of the regular holiday dates, please notify the instructor & the office administrator well in advance. This is equally important for competitive and non-competitive classes.

I understand the importance of regular attendance in my child's class (es) in order to properly progress in their training and to support the level of the class as a group.

### **Covid 19 Symptoms Protocols & Illness Policy**

Albertans should monitor their symptoms every day to help protect others and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

- Adults over 18 should stay home and get tested if they have COVID-19 symptoms.
- Children under 18 should refer to the daily screening checklist for instructions.

If my child exhibits symptoms of being un-well such as listed under the Covid 19 symptoms policy, I will keep my child home from dance in order to protect the well-being of the other dancers and the instructors at Marr Mac Dance.

If my child becomes ill while at Marr Mac, they will be isolated from the class. A phone call will be made to the parent or guardian who will then come and pick up their child immediately from the studio.

### **Competition Policy**

Dancers registered in competitive classes will be allowed a limited number of missed classes between Sept - April. At the discretion of the instructor, the dancer may or may not compete due to missed classes.

My child is registered in a competitive class (es) and we understand that regular weekly attendance is necessary in order to participate in competitions.

I understand there are extra competition fees involved & I agree to pay all fees as they are due. I agree to my child entering up to 3 local competitions, as well as 1 out of town (if applicable to my child's competitive class) that Marr Mac Dance chooses.

#### **Dress Code Policy**

I am aware that Marr Mac has a specific dress code for each discipline. This includes clothing, jewelry and hair grooming.

I understand that not coming properly dressed for class may result in my child watching class that day.

### **Cancelation & Refund Policy**

The studio requires one months' notice of cancelation.

At the time of cancelation, I will not receive a refund for; the current month's fee, pianist, costume, or competition fees.

I understand that Marr-Mac Dance (Marr-Mac Schools Ltd.) does not give credit and or refunds for class missed due to holidays, vacation, illness, or weather.

### **Photo Policy**

I agree to the taking and use of photos of my child for Marr Mac purposes only, including advertisement, ie. Website, brochures.

#### **Pandemic Policy**

In the event of a pandemic where in studio classes are suspended, Marr Mac will continue to hold live stream classes online. Tuition fees will remain the same. The instructors will hold their live stream classes at the same scheduled time as the in-studio classes. Attendance will be kept track of for all online classes. Once Marr Mac is allowed to return to regular in studio classes, we will do so following Provincial Health guidelines. If a dancer wishes to withdraw from online classes, no refunds for paid tuition will be issued, however the family will not be charged the next month's tuition, even if less than 1 month's notice is given.

<u>General Liability</u> I further understand that there are risks of physical or property damages, losses, or injury that may result from my child's participation with Marr Mac Dance and voluntarily assume the risks associated with such participation.

<u>Communication Policy</u> Marr Mac's primary method of communication to its registered families is through email. There are also two handbooks which are created to explain the details of the dance season including: holidays, costuming, year-end show, competitions, etc. I understand that Marr Mac will be sending correspondence through email on a regular basis. I give my consent to receive correspondence from Marr Mac via email.

<u>Payment Policy</u> I understand that fees are due on the 1st of each month in order for my child to participate in the class for the current month. Payment can be made by: 1. payment for the full year at registration 2. automatic monthly Credit Card payment 3. Etransfers monthly to <a href="mailto:1968@marrmac.com">1968@marrmac.com</a>

# 10/ Year End Show – Sunday June 11th Jubilee Auditorium

Marr Mac Dance's annual Year End Show is traditionally at the Jubilee Auditorium in June. This year's show date is currently Sunday June 11. Every year we choose a theme to guide teachers in their dances, costumes and music. This year the theme will be "Legends and Tributes", and the show will be dedicated to Deane Marr, founder of Marr Mac, who passed away in 2020. We will honour Deane and other "legends" who have played important roles in our lives and the dance and arts community through our dance themes and song choices. This year, we are planning to hold our show in its full capacity in June, given that restrictions and the current health situation allow us to do so. Please keep watch for any updates on this going forward.

DVDs and Blu-Rays of the performance are available for pre-order in the office near the end of the dance season and can be picked up during pre-registration days in June. Keep an eye out for information on pre order dates.

Dancers are scheduled to attend a dress rehearsal throughout the day and performance at 6:00 that evening. We highly encourage all parents and dancers to stay for the entire show, if bedtimes allow. We have made every effort to begin our show early in the evening and keep within a 2.5-hour time limit to help this cause. It is always disappointing for the older dancers to get out on stage and dance to a half empty audience, and always more fun for the wee ones to see the older dancers in action! A complete Year End Show Handbook and Backstage Guide will be emailed out later in the year.

# 11/ Costumes

Costumes are carefully chosen by instructors for competitions and/or our year end show performance in June. Costumes are ordered from dance costume catalogues, made by seamstresses, or purchased from stores where applicable.

We understand that families want to see their dancer up on stage in costumes that appropriately reflect the dancers age as well as the money spent. We are committed to restricting costumes that project sexuality, contain explicit graphic or textual content, and ensure that all costumes meet a certain standard of quality and artistry.

Costumes are ordered with growth in mind, and up-sized where appropriate. Costumes are tried on in class upon arrival to ensure the proper fit, and alterations are made where appropriate. Alterations are the responsibility of the parent, unless an error was made by Marr Mac.

Families who do not comply with their fee or costume payment obligations may be excluded from performances. Costume expenses are the responsibility of the parent, and costumes will not be issued to students with unpaid class fees.

### 12/ DancEnhance Parent Society & Annual Silent Auction

Please note: we have included this for your information but are unsure what the Annual Silent Auction will look like at this time due to COVID. Please stay tuned for more information as the year progresses.

DancEnhance Society is a registered, non-profit organization whose overarching goal is to provide support for enhanced learning and development opportunities for dancers in the community. Since our establishment in 2008, we have supported dancers in several ways including:

- Subsidizing dancers' expenses to attend workshops and dance trips
- Sponsoring guest instructors, choreographers and dance workshops in Edmonton
- Offering a 'Dream to Dance scholarship' for children of families in need who would like to take dance instruction.
- Funding our free "Summer Bootcamps" offered to all Marr Mac dancers ages 8 & up throughout the summer.

Annual memberships are available to the public (non-Marr Mac families) for \$10.

Every parent of a registered student at Marr-Mac Dance & Theatre Arts, and every Marr-Mac student over 18 years of age, is a member of the society. This is included in your Marr Mac Registration Fee.

DancEnhance Society is always in need of new board members. Board members meet a few times a year to discuss allocation of funds, new opportunities & fundraising, and for the AGM. The time commitment is minimal yet extremely valuable to the society and the dancers.

We highly encourage you to take part in the society if:

- you have an interest in supporting the society by attending meetings or as a board member (parents, grandparents, friends, welcome)
- have a dancer who is interested in attending workshops and dance trips during the year
- would like your dancer to receive subsidies from the Society towards workshops or dance trips in the future
- are interested in learning more about upcoming dance trips
- would like to assist in fundraising or trip planning

# 13/ Dance Levels, Ages, Disciplines & Streams

### **Level Breakdown**

Marr Mac's levels follow the following order:

- Creative Movement Ages 3-4
- Pre-Primary Ages 5-6
- Primary Ages 6-7
- Vaganova Prep/ Level 1 Prep Ages 7-8
- VB 1/ Level 1 Ages 9 10
- VB 2/ Level 2 Ages 10 11
- VB 3/ Level 3 Ages 11 12
- VB 4/Level 4 Ages 13 & up
- VB 5/ Level 5 Ages Approx 15 & up
- VB 6/Level 6 Ages Approx 16 & up (we do not have a level 6 every year as depending on the age of the dancers, they can graduate before completing level 6

As dancers require two years of training for each Vaganova Ballet (VB) level, students remain at the same level for two years from Level 1 and up. This applies to all disciplines to remain consistent. Although students are in the same numerical level for 2 years, the teachers constantly introduce new material and training over that duration so that students are constantly learning and progressing. Two years in the same level does not mean two years of the same teachings and training.

# **Ballet**

Marr Mac has two different options for Ballet classes, Vaganova Ballet and Ballet Technique.

The Vaganova Ballet (VB) classes follow the Vaganova Ballet Technique from the Vaganova Choreographic School in St. Petersburg, Russia. Students have the opportunity to prepare for and take part in Ballet Exams from Level 1 and up. These VB classes follow a specific syllabus suitable for their level and age. From Level 2 and up students are encouraged to take at least 2, preferably 3, ballet classes per week to properly train in this technique.

All "Ballet Technique" classes are also based on the Vaganova Technique, but are focused more on the developing technique rather than following a set syllabus. Therefore, the teaching is geared towards the specific student's needs and allows for the combination of different levels in the same class. These classes are offered for students who either; want an extra ballet class in their week on top of their VB classes, do not wish to follow the VB stream, or are wanting the ballet technique to support another sport. There is no show choreography component in this class.

# **Competitive Vs. Non-Competitive**

Marr Mac offers classes for both the competitive and non-competitive dancer. We, at Marr Mac, take pride in both streams of training and place emphasis on quality instruction for all classes.

- The non-competitive stream focuses on training and technique through the love of dance. Dancers work hard throughout the year to improve and excel in each discipline, and take part in the Marr Mac Year End Show in June. Students in the non-competitive stream may pick and choose which styles of dance they wish to take part in, with more "wiggle-room" than the Competitive stream as there are less class requirements and added commitments (time-wise and financially).
- The competitive stream begins at Level 1 Prep, for the majority, and is focused on holistically training a dancer as part of a team to compete in Spring competitions. The instructors thoughtfully assemble the competitive classes so there is unity within the group, as age and skill level must be in synch for the class to present well in competition. Please note there are certain class requirements for the competitive dancer to build and maintain the strength and technique that is required to train at that competitive level (listed below, by level). This extra commitment not only includes required classes, but also extra rehearsals, competitions to attend in April and May, as well as additional fees for guest choreography, costumes and competition fees. Please see the Competition Handbook for more information.

### 14/ RUSSIAN VAGANOVA BALLET EVALUATIONS

As a studio who values the growth and commitment of our dancers from all ages, it's our pleasure to offer ballet evaluations to students as part of our ballet program. Typically, these are held in March. An exact date/time will be confirmed at a later date via email. We encourage all students in VB1 and up, to take part in the evaluations.

Ballet training in the **Russian Vaganova Technique**, is a highly recognised ballet system worldwide. Guest Evaluators are invited who have themselves trained in the Russian technique through a recognized facility ie. The Vaganova Choreographic School in St. Petersburg, Russia or a similar highly qualified facility.

Our experience shows that formal evaluations present a unique opportunity for the children to display and take pride in how hard they work and can progress in their classes. Our students always find the experience to be uplifting, beneficial and rewarding. Students receive a written report card with valuable feedback to continue to perfect their ballet training and will also receive a certificate of completion from the **Vaganova Dance Society of Alberta**.

The teacher enters the evaluation with the dancers and conducts the class. Dancers enter in groups of up to 10 students. The atmosphere is very similar to their regular class setting where they can present their exercises in a relaxed and comfortable environment.

The Vaganova Dance Society of Alberta subsidizes the evaluation fee in order to support dancers who are learning this technique in the Province.

The balance of fees will be emailed to families closer to the dates of the evaluations, March 18-20 2022.

We are committed to restricting costumes that project sexuality, contain explicit graphic or textual content.

When you purchase or hire a product or service with Marr Mac Dance, the information we may collect from you includes your name, address, telephone numbers, email addresses, medical information and perhaps credit card or bank details. We only collect information directly from our students or their parent/guardians primarily for the purpose of providing services and products to you and to administer and manage invoicing and debt collection.

#### We offer the following options for fee payment:

**Upfront Payment** – you will receive your registration invoice prior to the commencement of the season and have until the first day of classes to pay these fees in full. These fees include registration fee, costume fees, pianist fee (if applicable), competition deposits (if applicable), photographer sitting fee and one months tuition (covers Sep).

If you choose to pay the entire year in full and are not already in a discounted tuition package (3 or more classes per week), you qualify for a discount depending on the number of enrolled classes; \$20 (one class per week) or \$30 (two classes per week).

**Monthly Payments** – Tuition will be posted to your account before the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month, and is due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. Invoices will not be emailed but accounts can be viewed at any time through our Parent Portal. Preferred method of monthly payment is automatic credit card payment which is set up through our Jackrabbit Parent Portal here: https://app.jackrabbitclass.com/jr3.0/ParentPortal/Login?orgId=541002.

**Payment Options:** Credit card payments through our Parent Portal are preferred and can be set up as an automatic monthly payment or can be paid monthly by logging in. Other methods are cheque, debit, or Internet Bank Transfer (E-Transfer). **Please note there is an NSF charge of \$25 added to all NSF cheque returns.** 

E-Transfers can be made to <u>1968@marrmac.com</u> with no password required. If fees remain unpaid in week 4 of classes students will not be permitted to participate in their lessons.

**Please note:** All students are invoiced based on a 10-month term from September to June and fees are averaged over this time. Monday class tuitions are now prorated to reflect statutory holidays. We charge a full fee for June to cover extra rehearsal time in-studio and at the Theatre.

**Cancellation Policy:** If you decide to withdraw from classes mid-season for any reason, one month notice and payment is required. Costume Fees, pianist fees and Competition Deposits will <u>not</u> be refunded after October 15. Refunds will not be issued for missed classes due to cancellation – where possible, we will endeavour to arrange make-up lessons for classes cancelled by Marr Mac or will offer an alternative class.

#### **Drop In Payments**

Our drop in classes can be paid as you attend via cash, debit, credit card or cheque to be paid at the office prior to class. Drop in punch cards are available for ease. All Drop-In students must sign in at the office prior to each drop in class.


